BIOGRAPHY

Brig. Gen. Darren L. Werner is the Commanding General, U.S. Army Tank-automotive and Armaments Command, Detroit Arsenal, Michigan. The command employs some 20,000 people and oversees a \$30 billion budget annually. In addition to the command staff at the headquarters, the general oversees activities at the Integrated Logistics Support Center, four depots and two arsenals, the Army's ground equipment supply chain, life cycle management services and sustainment efforts affecting active-duty Army units around the world.

His duties include directing policy and procedures affecting Army Materiel Command's ground equipment logistics, sustainment and public-private partnerships, as well as keeping the force supplied with ground equipment replacement parts to meet known and anticipated operational readiness requirements.



Werner was commissioned in 1988 through the Army Reserve Officer Training Corps at Central Michigan University. He has served in a variety of joint and command and staff assignments, including as commander at the battalion, brigade and major subordinate command levels. Prior to his current assignment, he served as the Commanding General of the 13th Sustainment Command, Fort Hood, Texas.
